Our Geography curriculum involves a combination of analysing, reading, recording and activities.

Analysing - A component of Geography is analysing, assist your child in these skills.

Reading - We have included suggestions for 6+ books for each term. Read a book/chapters each week, you may choose to read all the books, or some, re-reading your favourites.

Recording - Write, dictate a narration/notebook page for at least half the books read each term.

Some narrations may be oral, a simple chatting about the book, some are dictated to you and you scribe, some your child writes. Or your child may enjoy creating notebooking pages
